**Renfrew Museum & Park**

What today is the Renfrew Museum & Park was settled in the mid-18th century by the Scotch-Irish Renfrew Family. The land was later acquired and developed by German-American tanner Daniel Royer. The property boasts two successful farmsteads, a grist mill, lime kiln, and several outbuildings. Renfrew's final private residents, Edgar and Emma Nicodemus, lovingly restored the property which was bequeathed to the Borough of Waynesboro as a gift to its citizens following Emma's death in 1973.



**Tea & Tour Program**– Emma Nicodemus loved to entertain and invite guests into her home. Renfrew museum proudly carries on the tradition with volunteers dressed in period attire serving lunch from a local caterer along with piping hot local teas. Following tea, a docent will guide you on a tour of the historic Cumberland Valley homestead decorated for the holidays.
